English	We will be looking at fiction and non-fiction texts around our theme of claws, paws and jaws. We will be studying stories with a familiar pattern - Handa's Hen. We will explore new vocabulary and use this to create our own characters for the story. In non-fiction writing, we will look at and create fact files on different animals. We will continue to focus on the structure of sentences, making appropriate spelling choices, the use of correct punctuation and reading our work back to check it makes sense. In handwriting we will be looking at forming letters with appropriately sized ascenders and descenders. Phonics will be taught daily and please continue to send in reading folders every day. Spelling tests will also continue to be on Fridays, with common exception words which can't be sounded out phonetically, shown in bold on the spelling list.
