

## Half -Termly Topic Plan Year 4 Spring 2

	Topic: What makes the Earth angry?
<b>Literacy</b>	Our class book is 'When the Giant Stirred' by Celia Godkin, the story of a volcanic island in the Pacific Ocean.
	We will be concentrating on grammatical features of the text (expanded noun phrases, pronouns, subordinate
	clauses, fronted adverbials with commas, punctuating direct speech correctly). As part of our Science work on
	the water cycle, we will write about the journey of a raindrop. Daily reading will take place, alongside weekly
	comprehension work and we will be taking part in 'World Book Day'. There will be regular phonics and spelling
	'zappers' practice (focusing on plurals and words containing anti, inter-, -cian, -sion and -tion), with spelling
	assessments taking place on a Thursday. A new half-termly, Year 4 statutory word list will be sent home in week
	1, to be tested in the last week. Please encourage your child to regularly work on reading and spellings at home,
	so they feel more confident in their daily work.

Numeracy	We will start the half term by learning about division and length before moving onto fractions. Throughout the
	half term, we will be constantly reinforcing the four written calculation methods and applying them to a range of
	problems and reasoning tasks. We will then look at decimals (both the place value and how to use them in a range
	of contexts). There will be daily work on times tables and familiarisation with the MTC (Multiplication
	Timestables Check). The mental maths 'SMIRF' facts are handed out / assessed each Tuesday. Please encourage
	your child to regularly work on these at home, as it will greatly support their maths work in class.
